LEADER PREPARATION

- » Preview DVD "Introductory Session"
- » Read/Review the lesson and the DVD Notes with attention to the Leading Idea, Scripture references, and definitions where applicable.
- » Have a Study Guide available for each participant.
- » Pray for open hearts and minds.

GROUP MEETING

- I. Introducing the Lesson (approximately 15 minutes) (Study Guide page 1)
 - 1. As this is your first session, take some time for the participants to introduce themselves and become familiar with one another.
 - 2. Read the following Scriptures to introduce the idea that the Bible speaks to every sphere of life and living:

Psalm 19:7-11

"The law of the LORD is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple. 8 The statutes of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes. 9 The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring forever: the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether. 10 More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb. 11 Moreover by them is thy servant warned: and in keeping of them there is great reward."

- 3. Ask the participants to begin thinking about the following ideas. Do not generate discussion, simply generate thought:
 - A. In your view, where does our nation stand in relation to Biblical values? Why?
 - B. | Who is most responsible for this the Christian or the non-Christian?
 - C. | How could you, as an individual, work to effect change in our nation?
- 4. Comment to the participants: "Forgetting or forsaking the Hand of God in history, forgetting that God does rule in the affairs of men, forgetting or forsaking the Word of God as our American political textbook, our economic textbook, our social, cultural, educational textbook; this alone has produced the results we have in our nation today." ²
